This is important to everyone because if delinquencies go above 15% of the membership, if there are more than 50% tenants in occupancy or if there is an outstanding lawsuit, you will likely be ineligible to sell or refinance your home FHA or VA and most other lenders won't finance either. Assessment dues are important for maintaining all areas of the budget for the association. Hang in there.

CENSUS IS DUE
