
Fairmont Hill Happenings

Dog Poop

The problem with dog owners not cleaning up after their pets is getting worse. No one should have to put up with stepping in dog poop, cleaning it up to get to your front door, getting it in your hands when cleaning out planters and slopes or flying up in your face when mowing. Fines go from \$50 to \$500 for each occurrence. Landlords get the fines but usually pass them on to the tenant or if the problem keeps repeating they evict for repeated breaking of rules. This is a health issue as well as safety from slipping and falling after stepping in a pile. Please be a good neighbor and clean up after your dog or report the person who isn't so we can get this stopped with just a letter first and then resorting to fines. Property inspections are going to pay very close attention to areas involved and follow up with nearby residents.

Do not be shy, don't think it's too small of an issue or not a big deal. We want to hear from you.
