GUTTER CLEANING/ROOF MAINTENANCE: The Board approved the proposal from Antis for roof maintenance and gutter cleaning. Antis has Glenwood on its schedule for the week of January 6th.


CLUBHOUSE UPGRADES: The community makes great use of the clubhouse for special events. Because it has been a long time since anything has been done to the interior, the Board has tasked a committee consisting of Pat Middlebrooks (chair), Rick Counterman, and Erin Ramachandran to develop plans for upgrading the inside of the clubhouse. The types of upgrades are painting interior walls, replacing carpet, removing old wallpaper, putting in counters and some cabinets in one of the rooms, and purchasing a normal size refrigerator. The small kitchenette refrigerator constantly needs defrosting and is way too small. These are just some of the possibilities the committee will be considering. The newsletter will keep the community updated on what ideas are presented to the Board.

STREETLIGHT KNOCKED OVER:

The streetlight by 650 Glenwood Drive was knocked over. Thanks to the quick actions of Pat Middlebrook the fire department was called. StoneKastle after-hours was also contacted by Glenwood's president and they sent out Tyler Lighting who services the lamp poles and lighting in Glenwood.

The Fire Department thought that the street light was hit by a car. A police report has been filed. If anyone saw this happened please contact Dona Goetz, Glenwood's property manager.

The speed limit in Glenwood is 15 mph. Drive responsibly and take responsibility for what you do.



PARKING IN GLENWOOD: Patrol One has found several parking violations over the last couple of months where cars had to be towed or cited because the car was either parked on the street and not safelisted, or not parked correctly on the driveway. Please remember, especially during this holiday season, there is no overnight street parking in Glenwood between the hours of 2 a.m. and 5 a.m. *except* by limited permit **and** only in the spots designated "Overnight Parking By Permit Only."



To obtain an overnight parking permit you must contact Patrol One (www.patrol-one.com) with your assigned Safelist Confirmation Number to access Patrol One's Safelist Program. If you are new to the neighborhood and do not have your assigned Safelist Confirmation Number, please contact Dona Goetz.

Remember cars that are not safelisted will be towed. The only exception to towing is homeowner/tenant car with a G sticker. A homeowner car with a G sticker is not subject to tow **BUT** is subject to citation (monetary fine). *Remember, a G sticker is not a parking permit. You still need to Safelist your car, even if you have a G sticker*.

HOLIDAY DECORATIONS: To help ensure that our landscapers can cut the grass by your unit during the holiday season please abide by the holiday decoration rules contained in Glenwood's Rules and Regulations. Decorations may not extend beyond the unit lot line with the exception that bushes immediately adjacent to your property may be lighted. The unit lot line is defined as "that area within the eves drip line and patio and/or deck fence."

Holiday decorations are to be removed no later than 10 days following the holiday. However, this January if you can remove them sooner that would be greatly appreciated since Antis will be starting the roof maintenance and gutter cleaning starting the week of January 6^{th} .

HOLIDAY TRASH PICK-UP SCHEDULE: MG Disposal, a Republic Services Company, observes various holidays. On Republic Services website it shows they observe Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Day, Independence Day, Memorial Day, and Labor Day. If your service day (for Glenwood it is Thursday) falls on, or after one of these holidays, the trash pick-up service will be delayed by one day. For example, Christmas and New Years are on Wednesday; therefore, Glenwood's trash pick-up will be on Friday.

Glenwood posts a sign on the front entry gate when trash pick-up will occur on Friday rather than Thursday. Thank-you, Jeannine DeMarks for doing that.

<u>SCHEDULE FOR POOL VOLUNTEERS:</u> Thanks to StoneKastle, our pool volunteers are being notified at the beginning of their volunteer pool month. The pool volunteers for November were Cindy and Madison Torres. Thank-you both for being Glenwood volunteer angels.

GLENWOOD'S DELINQUENCY POLICY: The property management company must receive your monthly assessment by the 15th of the month. If not received by the 15th, a \$20 late fee is charged. Thirty days after the due date, a pay or lien letter will be sent via certified mail explaining that if full payment is not received within thirty (30) days, collection proceedings will commence. Sixty (60) days after the due date, if payment is not received, a lien will be filed against the property and notice sent to the owner. Ninety (90) days after the due date, and payment has not been received, foreclosure proceedings will be initiated.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT: Volunteering in your community has enormous benefits to others as well as to yourself. In November of '96 I called their Volunteer Coordinator and made an appointment for an interview. I was well received, and they hoped I could start ASAP. I told them I would not be available till after the first of the year (1998). I began volunteering the first workday of the new year, 1998. Flash forward to 2019. Twenty-two years have passed. I am still volunteering at ASF (now named Radiant Health Care). I go in 2 days a week.

I think that whatever I do is more of a benefit to me than to the organization. It keeps me active and alert and I know I am appreciated. So, during this Season of Giving, please consider doing something for someone less fortunate: volunteer. Believe me, your efforts will be appreciated. I know, I've been thanked twice a week for the last 22 years.
