Pool Committee: Chris Pavik, Chair

Works to ensure that the pool area is kept in good condition and is usable by the community.

Clubhouse Committee: Mary Rupp and Carolyn Eckert

Helps to ensure clubhouse is neat and clean and are the points of contact for reserving the clubhouse for a personal event.

Architectural Committee: Phil DeMarks, Chair

Makes recommendations of approval or disapproval to the Board of an owner's request to install, alter, and remodel such outdoor items as walls, buildings, fences, landscaping, and satellite dishes. This oversight helps maintain the value, desirability, and attractiveness of Glenwood for the benefit of all Members of the Association.

Hospitality Committee: Rosalie McKenzie and Virginia Luzi Welcomes new residents to Glenwood. The committee also plans socializing events for the community.

Security/Parking: Virginia Luzi, Chair

Oversees the community's parking rules and regulations. Parking permits are handled through Patrol One's Safelist Program.

The Board encourages everyone to get involved and volunteer to serve on one of these great committees.



SCHOOL IS BACK IN SESSION: All residents must be alert while driving in the community since school is back in session. Children are walking to and from Golden Hills School...the back gate is very busy during the school year. Parents, please make sure the gate is closed and locked after usage.

LARGE ITEMS FOR HAUL AWAY: Large items, or multiple items that are meant for disposal or pickup cannot be left outside of your home or left on the street before the pickup or haul away day. Plan accordingly and only put things out the night before or day of pick-up.

Reminder: Please be considerate of the work that the pool volunteers do by disposing of your own trash, washing up any spills, wiping off tables when used, and returning furniture back to original position and location after use. The pool volunteers say thank you.

NO SMOKING IN POOL OR CLUBHOUSE AREA: No smoking is allowed in the pool or clubhouse area. Multiple signs are posted around these areas informing owners and guests of this rule. If you see someone smoking in the pool or clubhouse area, please report it to the property management company.

SATELLITE DISHES: Please be aware that based upon our rules and regulations, satellite dishes are permitted only after an architectural form is submitted to the Architectural Committee and Board of Directors for approval. If you have installed a satellite dish and did not get approval, please contact the Architectural Committee and work with them to ensure compliance.

<u>WATER AND IRRIGATION:</u> The City of Fullerton has changed the summer watering schedule from two times a week to three. Glenwood is now watering three times a week. Our thirsty plants are bit happier!

GARAGE SAFETY: A couple of homeowners on the north side of our community had unknown persons enter through unlocked side doors with report of one theft. Please keep all doors closed and locked and do not leave any valuables in your car, even if it is in your garage.
