New Look, Worth the Wait!

The Mabury Ranch Homeowners Association Board of Directors (MRHOA) is excited to announce the completion of the stunning redesign of our front entrances. After a series of setbacks, financial and otherwise, our new Board made completing this project, a top priority. It took Herculean efforts to get the new stone cladding installed on the monuments and on the corner planters before Christmas. Holiday lights were installed on the monument and the first tree at each entrance was wrapped in hundreds of white holiday lights.

In March, turf was removed from the front of each median and new drip irrigation, installed. The new landscape design features Strawberry trees in each of the entrance corner planters, Carissa Green Carpet ground cover, Dianella and red Ivy Geraniums. A landscape architect came up with the initial design and the Front Entrance Redesign Committee worked with contractors to execute the plans. The new entrance redesign required replacing dozens of existing plants. Instead of trashing them, the Landscape Committee took on the task of repurposing them elsewhere in Mabury Ranch. Four areas benefited from the replanting: Teton & the West Greenbelt, Bryce & the West Greenbelt, Glacier & Waterton and the Taft Extension between Mt. McKinley and Cannon. In all, more than two dozen plants including Daylilies, Verbena, Agapanthus and Evolvulus were repurposed for a savings of \$1,267. Special thanks to Stephanie Tilhof and Joe Digrado for getting their hands dirty.
