In addition to completing the entryways, the Board will need to tackle a number of pressing issues, including restoring social events in our 2024 budget, fighting inflation, updating our governing docs to ensure Mabury Ranch stays a single-family neighborhood, and finding ways to enhance security. By addressing these items, I believe Mabury Ranch can be the best community in Orange. With your support, we can make this happen in 2024!

With a new Board comes new energy. This Board will consider this large list of action items:

Social Events

Over the years our social committee has done a great job of creating events on a very tight budget. Last year the social committee saw their budget cut for the 2023 year. Starting in 2024 the board will look to donors and sponsors to help revive events.

Budget

Addressing the issues facing MRHOA and maintaining a budget during periods of high inflation has proven challenging. While we had to pass a dues increase this year, it is our hope that we can avoid another one next year.

For the first time in years, our members are taking an active role in our budget committee and looking for ways to change the spending trajectory.

Front Entryways

First and foremost, this Board is committed to finishing the front entryway project. This project began more than 4 years ago and has fallen victim to high inflation and slow project management.

Our volunteers have spent significant hours discussing and reviewing plans. While we are

pleased that the masonry is completed, a new phase is about to begin. Look for plants in early 2024!

Updating Governing Docs

Many of our governing docs can be traced back to the 1970's. Since then, much has changed in the city and state. We've been advised to update our documents to reflect recent changes in laws and civil codes. This multi-year task will provide some protection to keep Mabury Ranch the single family community we all want it to be.
